

and 7. His topic being, the Electrical System, starting with the basic concepts. Thanks Ray!



THE ELECTRICAL SYSTEM


During a number of conversations and discussions over the years it is apparent that the area of our Model A that is least understood by many members is *The Electrical System*. So, I thought I might write a number of articles to explain, without getting **too** deep into the technical side of things, what goes on in electrical systems. However, some basic knowledge of the structure of matter, magnetism and electrical theory is needed to follow the operation of components and systems. Let's start with:

THE STRUCTURE OF MATTER

All matter is made up of Atom, which in turn, consist of Electrons, Protons and Neutrons. Electrons have a negative (-ve) electrical charge, Protons have a positive (+ve) electrical charge and Neutrons have no electrical charge and therefore have no part to play in electrical theory.

Neutrons are located with the Protons in the centre or nucleus of the atom.

Electrons rotate around the Protons in a number of orbits similar to our solar system. The simplest of all atoms is the Hydrogen atom, which has only one electron and one proton. Copper most commonly used as a conductor in our systems has 29 electrons rotating in four orbits around 29 Protons.



The electrons in orbit are attracted to the protons in a similar way to our planets being attracted to the sun. The intensity of the attraction determines whether the material is a conductor or an insulator. The electrons in the outer orbit of copper atoms are very loosely attracted and can be easily pushed away from the atom, therefore, copper is a good conductor.

The electrons in an insulator, such as porcelain used in spark plugs or plastic surrounding wires, are very tightly bound to the protons so cannot be easily be forced to leave the atom. When a force is applied to the atoms of a conductor, electrons move along the conductor from one atom to another throughout the length of the conductor. When this happens we have what is called an electron flow or **ELECTRICAL CURRENT** which is measured in **Amps**. The force that caused the movement is **VOLTAGE** which is measured in **Volts**.

The **RESISTANCE** to the movement of electrons in the conductor is measured in **Ohms.** The resistance of a conductor will depend on the material from which it is made, the cross sectional area (thickness), and length of the conductor If you increase the thickness you decrease the resistance, and if you increase the length you increase the resistance.

There is a direct relationship that exists between these three factors. Technically it is stated in Ohm's Law as:

"THE CURRENT FLOWING IN AN ELECTRICAL CIRCUIT IS DIRECTLY PROPORTIONAL TO THE VOLTAGE AND INVERSELY PROPORTIONAL TO THE RESISTANCE."

In simple terms this means that if you increase or decrease the voltage (force –volts) then the current (amps) will increase or decrease at the same rate.

If you increase the resistance (Ohms) you decrease the current (amps) at the same rate or if you decrease the resistance you increase the current at the same rate.

It can be important to remember this when trying to work out why electrical components sometimes don't work as they should. I will expand on this in a later article.

NOVEMBER OUTING/MEETING REPORT

Ashley and Elizabeth organised an interesting run to the Bouvard Winery which is a few miles south of the Port Bouvard bridge (south of Mandurah). This was their first outing organised, and it was great for a newer family to tackle a run and have it well supported. We had 14 Model A's and 4 moderns.



After meeting in Murdock, the group headed to Mandurah, over the Bouvard Bridge, turning left and driving along the Estuary, stopping in a shady area for morning tea.

The Winery had a function happening so we had to move away a little. The meeting was held under some shady trees.

Bill Spencer was an electrician, running a business from his comprehensive workshop in Subiaco in the 1970s through to his retirement to Busselton around 1990. He had a passion for Model A's and early 1930s Ford vehicles. He purchased any vehicles from this era he could get his hands on.

A very good friend, Jim Williams, who currently lives in a retirement village in Como, did most of the work on Bill's cars. There was no payment to Jim but he built up a Model A Woodie from Bill's collection of Model A bits for himself. This vehicle is now owned by my son, Darren.

Jim referred to Bill's collection of Car bits as Aladdin's Cave.

Jim recalls that Brian Corlett who now lives in Esperance did the paint job for Bill.

When Bill sold his Subiaco workshop Jim took ten truck and trailer loads of car parts to a new purpose built shed in Busselton! All was sold at auction following Bill's passing a year later.

John Carter purchased the near completed 1930 Coupe from the estate auction, had it upholstered at the cost of \$5000, and owned it for around three years. During this time it was not seen or heard of!

John owned and operated a trucking business in WA. He also owned and operated the Kirup Tavern at one stage back in the late eighties, early nineties!

I was hoping to speak with John to get some information of his ownership and perhaps a photo or two!

I keep a registry of all Model A owners and have done for 30 years (no names are ever taken off my list!). From that list I phoned John and Brenda Carter but the phone number was not connected! Not to be out done I looked up the Residential Phone book for a J and B Carter, not listed and there were 55 J Carters listed! Next I phoned Steve and Lorna Wigmore as I knew they purchased their Red Ute from John. Steve looked up his receipt dated 2004 from the ute purchase but there were no clues for me to follow!

Ron Perry from Mundaring (once a member of our Club) purchased the red Coupe from John Carter in 1998!! Ron is a member of the Avon Valley Vintage Car Club and has owned and restored several Model A's since I have known him. Ron and his family have been friends with Edith and I since around 1970. Ron has owned at least a dozen vintage cars but seldom takes them out and about! No work had to be done to the Coupe while Ron owned it except the black guards were repainted ready for it's sale.

Tony Pernechele purchased it from Ron in 1993 and it now resides in Tony's fabulous Ford Museum towards Toodyay on his farm. Our Club has visited the Museum many years ago. It has grown in recent times and must be ready for a second club visit! An easy run to organise for a willing club member for this year.

I took the Coupe photo above on a recent visit. Tony has two other Model A's in his museum plus dozens of other Fords. AJ

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
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
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
