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

1930 Phaeton

In the spring of 2008, Horace and Jean attended the Floriade in Canberra, travelling with their caravan. Horace and Jean proceeded to Bega, NSW where they arrived at a caravan park at about the same time as



Trevor and Nola Hooper, members of the Veteran Car Club of WA Inc. Trevor and Nola had come from Queensland with their caravan, and the two couples spent some time chatting. Of course, vintage cars were included in the chatting, and Horace said he would love to have a vintage car. He was thinking of a Model T. Trevor told Horace that there were a variety of vintage vehicles available in WA, and suggested that Horace join him at a Parts Shed morning – Trevor is a regular at the Wednesday morning working sessions held at the Parts Shed at the VCC's club rooms at Wattle Grove. The Hoopers were not returning to Perth immediately, but the arrangement was to be finalised when they did.

Horace joined Trevor at the VCC Parts shed on a Wednesday in November or December. He met Frank Cocks, a former member of the Model A Restorers Club of WA (Inc.), along with many of the regulars. He again expressed interest in a Model T, but was encouraged to look for a Model A instead. During January, the Parts Shed does not operate on Wednesday mornings to give the workers a break in the heat, but that year (2009) Horace went along to assist with some essential work. MARC of WA club member Ray Mahony was also helping, and Horace learned of the meeting to be held on Sunday 18th January at Manning Park.

Horace and Jean came along to the picnic meeting. Jean brought a book she was reading, but was persuaded to join in the fun and games instead. They sat with John and Helen Moorehead, and Kath and Kelvin Pepper, and say that they just felt that they belonged. The membership application form was completed on the spot, and they were inducted into the club that very day.

Horace and Jean did not realize that a Model A was not required for members to attend runs and meetings, so they did not attend for a few months. From Frank Cocks, Horace purchased a 1928 Ute/Utility which had been cut down from a Phaeton. Frank had put it together from various bits and pieces, mainly from the Parts Shed. It was nearly complete, but a ground up restoration needed to be done. Horace realised it would be a long process, so he spoke with John Moorehead, Alan Jeffree and other club members, to find a running Model A.

Western Model A News

1930 Phaeton—cont'd

The Miskos were fishing in Monkey Mia in May 2009 when they received a message from Alan Jeffree to contact Barry Bristow-Stagg about a 1930 Phaeton for sale in Northam. Horace contacted Barry and was given the name of the Phaeton's owner: Eddie Whittington, who worked at Dempsters Engineering in Northam. Unable to locate a personal phone number for Eddie, Horace phoned his workplace, leaving a message for Eddie to contact him. Eddie rang in the evening, and Horace and Jean went up the following weekend and liked what they saw. It had not been used for some time, only for the Whittington's son's wedding, and there was quite a bit of work to be done. They purchased it, returning the following weekend to pick it up. Eddie kindly provided a trailer to transport the Phaeton to Perth. Barry Bristow-Stagg will seek information from Eddie Whittington about his purchase of the Phaeton. Club member Steve Read thinks it had been at a Thornlie or Gosnells car yard.

Horace got to work preparing the Phaeton for registration. It had never had a "body off" restoration and was a "bitzer", with a 1928 diff and engine. The body was sound and fairly original. The hood had to be refurbished. Because there is so much wood in 1930 Model A's, there was far too much movement to be safe, so the doors were strengthened. He worked on the steering and the brakes, and changed the front axle.

One day Horace drove it to Steve Read's for checking, but Steve was busy and suggested that he return in the afternoon. While returning home, he had a problem: a corroded cylinder head gave way and ended up with a hole the size of a 10 cent piece. He phoned Jean who grabbed a tow rope and came to tow the Model A home. Horace went to Steve's as planned in the afternoon, but without the Model A. Steve offered him a choice from his collection, and Horace returned home to replace the cylinder head, then took the Model A back to Steve's the next day. One day, driving to show the Phaeton to a dear friend, a neighbor near their old home, they went over some railway tracks and all the doors blew open. On returning home, Horace readjusted the door locks.

Horace took the engine to Southside Engineering Reconditioners in Myaree, on the recommendation of Alex Kirkwood. They rebored the cylinders, doing a good job and completing it quickly. During this time, he used the engine from the 1930 Tudor which is his next project. Other than having the engine rebored, Horace did it all himself. He made a lot of the bits he needed. He got good advice from Steve Read and other club members. The whole process was good experience – he knows what to do for the next one!

The Phaeton was registered on 18 December 2009. The Registration Number was 1DFZ 463. Horace attempted to arrange a registration plate from Morawa, but was unsuccessful. When they were holidaying in Shark Bay in 2011, he went into the Shire Office to see if he could get one there, and found there was no problem. So he requested 1930 SB, which was delivered to the metropolitan licensing centre in Kelmscott. He learned later that club member Brett Pollock was involved in the design of the Shark Bay logo during his time as Shire President there.

Horace and Jean enjoyed the Woolleen trip in 2012 but did not take a Model A. Instead they towed the first Teardrop Caravan Horace made.

They enjoyed the wonderful tour of a working station.

They particularly enjoyed the shakedown run to Busselton in September 2013, in preparation for the National Meet in September 2014. The weather was terrible, but it was the Phaeton's longest ever outing, to Busselton, Augusta and Molloy Island.



ELECTRICITY AND MAGNETISM

MAGNETISM (continued)

The polarity of an electro-magnet is determined by the direction of the winding and the direction of the current flow. If you change the direction of the winding, the polarity will change and if you change the direction of the current flow, the polarity will change. If you change both at the same time, then the polarity will be the same as before.



Multiple magnets can be used to either increase or decrease the overall strength of the magnet. The strength of an electro-magnet fields is stated as the **ampere-turn value**; ie. the number of turns in the winding multiplied by the current flowing.

Even though the Department of Transport no longer requires annual inspections for concession 404 vehicle registrations, our Club decided that such examinations are in the best interest of our members. In the past years examiners have found problems, mostly minor, that the owner was not aware of, which could have developed into major issues, sometimes effecting safety. The Club by-laws have always required annual inspection of both fully and concessionally registered vehicles but last year our Club decided to make inspections voluntary.

Annual examinations are a service to Club members to help them keep their Model A in a safe and reliable condition even though the Department of Transport now states that it is the responsibility of each owner to see their vehicle is maintained.

Inspections are held at the VCC Club facility in Hale Rd, Forrestfield on Sunday 10th May, between 8am and Midday. Morning tea and a sausage sizzle will be available.

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
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
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
