# DÉJÀ UU BUSSELTON RALLY

After much anticipation, attendees were welcomed on the evening of Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> September to Rally HQ at the home and grounds of Wes Hartley and Beverley Biggs in Busselton, to part re-enact the 23<sup>rd</sup> National Model A Meet hosted nine years earlier in September 2014 by the Model A Restorers Club of WA.

It was called *The 2023 Déjà vu Rally*, designed with a flexible program, particularly for those whose work commitments only enabled them to be present for part of the proceedings.

After liberal refreshments, participants were presented with specially made cloth rally bags that contained much-needed information, such as route schedules, list of participants, locality map; all things necessary for the serious rallying planned over the following four days.

At 8.30am on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> October our Model As, along with Peter Sartori's XL Falcon and Dean Robert's FE Holden gathered ahead of a 9.00am start for a 125 mile run (200 kms) that took in Carbunup River, Wildwood Road, statutory coffee on Caves Road, before travelling to the exquisite beauty of the Karri

trees of the Boranup Forest, ahead of arrival in Augusta for lunch.

Following lunch it was on to the Cape Leeuwin Lighthouse, where the Southern Ocean and Indian Ocean meet. The weather was wild and windy.

Some chose to explore the excellent maritime museum, while the hardy took the 200-odd steps to the top of the lighthouse, an unbelievable feat of 19<sup>th</sup> Century engineering and construction skill. Replicating the wild descriptions of roaring seas, fearful for mariners, who were dependent on Leeuwin's saving light, we literally pushed ourselves out onto the external parapet, with winds so fierce that we were being blown backwards.

Then it was the descent for resuming our journey, this time back through Margaret River, Cowaramup, then Jindong-Treeton Road, before heading back to Busselton Rally HQ after a long and event-filled day. Numerous Model A stories were part of the *Nibble and Natter* session, before

preparations were make for Rally Day No. 2.

Day 2 of the Rally on Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> September was a shorter run of 60 miles (100 kms) that took in the distinctive coastal beauty of Dunsborough, Sugarloaf Rock and Cape Naturaliste, before heading to Yallingup for lunch, overlooking the wilds of the Indian Ocean. This was followed by a short journey to Canal Rocks, prior to arrival at Simmo's for much anticipated coffee and ice cream, before returning to Busselton Rally HQ.

Saturday evening was a fully-catered BBQ, in addition to many additional offerings of food, wine and dessert, culminating with the cutting of a specially decorated *Déjà vu Rally* cake. All agreed that it had been a great day of fun and fellowship - the stuff of which Model As seem to bring out in all of us.

Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> September was a special day as we collaborated with the Busselton Chapter of the Veteran and Classic Car Club of WA as they hosted the annual *"Joe Steddy Rally"*. There was a delightful variety of cars assembled for viewing, before we set off on a gentle run of 60 miles (100 kms), with lots of rally questions to be

In the latter part of Sunday afternoon, several took the opportunity to experience the Busselton Underwater Observatory, along with a trip on the Jetty train, before everyone gathered at The Equinox for an early fish and chip dinner by the ocean, watching the sun gradually set on another great day.

Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September that involved a journey of 150 miles (240kms), which began with a pleasant run of 40 miles to Nannup for morning tea and a brief tour of the town, before

heading out on the Balingup-Nannup Road to Kevin and Margaret Bird's property to view the world's largest wooden clock built by Kevin from natural WA

timbers. Many marveled at the sheer ingenuity of the construction and the manner in which time pieces were developed from the 15<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> Centuries, revolutionising the whole concept of time and space. Parallels were drawn of the power of human ingenuity of the likes of Henry Ford who took hold of a fledgling automotive idea and turned it into a reality that literally changed the world.

We then motored through the forest canopy towards Balingup for lunch, then to Kirup and Donnybrook for afternoon tea. The return journey to Rally HQ, was via Capel, then the back roads of Tutunup, Ludlow and

Hithergreen, before heading back to Busselton after another eventful day of motoring.



On the Monday evening, the *Déjà vu Rally* team took over the Emerald Chinese Restaurant in Busselton for a sumptuous feast, as a fitting way to conclude 420 miles (675 kms) of Model A motoring over four days, through some of the most beautiful scenery in Australia.

On Tuesday morning, 19<sup>th</sup> September, participants gathered for a sumptuous breakfast at Rally HQ ahead of journeys

back to Perth. Everyone spoke of their delight at being able to participate and the quality of the facilities at Rally HQ. Ron Andrews observed the food was *"to die for"*. Certainly no one went home hungry. The only note of disappointment expressed was that more had not been able to avail themselves of the opportunity.

However, it was unanimously agreed that regional events such as the Busselton *Déjà vu Rally* add a great deal to the variety of opportunities the Club provides, highlighting anticipation of the 29<sup>th</sup> National Model A Meet that our club will host in Albany during October 2026.

### MODEL A COMINGS AND GOINGS

The 1928 Panel Van mentioned in last month's newsletter was bought by new member Mark Quinn.

### TECHNICAL TIP

#### Allan Jeffree

#### De-Rusting and Coating a Model A Fuel tank

With all my panel preparation, I start the de-rusting by placing the rusty panel in an old "bath" of water, with a hand full of washing soda thrown in. Then I connect an old computer power supply (12V) to it and leave it for several days (depending on size). The positive goes to a sacrificial anode in the water, and the negative goes to the panel. This is **most Important** - get it wrong and the process eats away your panel. If the object doesn't get fully covered with water, just do half at a time.

The photo shows me de-rusting a Model A fuel tank, half at a time. The anode is any piece of steel (larger for large objects being de-rusted). The amount of time you leave it in depends on the amount of rust - could take one day or three. After the bath, sand off the remaining rust and Ranex the cleaned surface and keep dry until undercoating.



Then to clean the inside of my tank, I selected a jam tin of blue metal with pieces approximately a half inch in size

and tipped them into the tank. I then tumbled it attached to my cement mixer for two days. It is **very** noisy - you need good neighbours! The reason for knowing the number of pieces of blue metal is to make sure you've got all the pieces out once finished.



Looking at the photo to the left, you will see why it takes time to get the blue metal out - each corner of these divisions has small cut off corners. I have also used this method to clean out the water jacket in a Model A block.

To coat the inside of the tank, there is a product available from your vehicle parts shops which is a three step process. Just follow their instructions.

The Model A tank has several compartments, so I placed my tank back on our cement mixer for tumbling for each step. I have a fitting which attached to my camera and here is a photo of the inside once complete!

### MEMBER'S SHED ACTIVITIES

**Daniel Pinnington** had to provide close supervision as Peter Sartori, Ron Andrews and Gerry ten Bokkel replaced the Clutch Release Arm mechanism arm in his Fordor that failed during the Busselton Déjà vu Rally.











**Ian Steer** also had a Déjà vu Rally experience (that was much more easily fixed than Daniel's problem).

<u>The symptoms</u>: ammeter waving about all over the place and engine starting to miss and backfire as the car got hotter - then all is good when the car cools down.

<u>The solution</u>: - tighten the bolt on the main cable on the fuse holder that obviously wasn't tightened correctly after the recent wiring loom replacement!

(My theory is the bolt lengthened (and the joint loosened) as the engine bay got hotter, then tightened (to some degree) as the bolt cooled-down.)

My radiator is also ready to be re-installed after the 2nd attempt to get a minor leak (weep) fixed.
