
MARC MARCH ACTIVITIES IN YEARS GONE BY

30 Years Ago: Various amendments were approved to the club constitution during the meeting (2 1/4 hours!) at McDougall Park. Notes from the Bendigo State Delegates Meeting. Big report from a trip to the Leach farm near Boyanup by the Jeffrees, Cookes (Mike & Laurel), Andrews, Blewetts and Philips where the Andrews tent did not survive the strong winds in the middle of the night.

February meeting report

Classic Car Show - Changed to the 8th September, 2024 at Ascot, with Media Junction WA being the organisers in conjunction with the CMC. The Model A National Meet will be winding up on that day, so some of the regulars will still be in Queensland. *A volunteer will be needed* to co-ordinate our members on the day. More information will be forthcoming in the coming months.

National Events, Australia wide, will be put up on the calendar on the CMC Website, for all to see.

A **new magazine** is underway to be put out by the CMC to all affiliated clubs and non member WA car clubs as well, to try and keep everyone abreast of what is happening in the wider car community.

Surplus Funds – the CMC holds considerable funds which it has accumulated over time. A new subcommittee is in the process of being set up to consider worthy applicants (car related) for a grant. Final decisions have to be approved by the Management Committee. This is still early days, but one to keep in mind for the future.

Australian Historical Motoring Federation (AHMF) – the CMC has recently re-joined this organisation after a break of some years. Funding may be available for national events from the Robert Shannon Foundation, which this body oversees. This organisation is in ongoing discussions with federal government departments in regard to motoring issues with a national interest, e.g. the recent survey of the old car movement and its economic benefits, insurance issues and so on.

MEMBER'S SHED ACTIVITIES

lan Steer. I was chasing a "flickering LED headlight" issue, and thought I would clean-up the earthing between the headlight shell and the headlight bar, and between the headlight bar and the mudguard. It's always a problem when you need nice fresh, shiny steel to get a good earth - which then rusts vigorously. I thought I would try some of this stuff (\$11 from Altronics) to slow-down the corrosion.

Contact me in 10 years to ask how it worked.


(Incidentally, I suspect the real problem was one as described in the technical tip from last month, ie bulb-to-socket contacts.)



SIMPLIFIED ZENITH CARBURETTOR

There are many articles on restoration of the Zenith carburettor as used on the Model A, and like the rest of the car, its 'beauty lies in its simplicity'. In order to better understand it myself, I have, with the help of those articles and a bit of compressed air, put together some photos and drawings showing the path taken by the petrol, and fuel mixture through the carburettor.



Outlet without restrictions to main jet

Numbered brass jet leading to both the idle jet and cap jet via the compensating well


Outlet to mixture adjusting valve

A later carburettor may have an air vent hole high on the side of the bowl above the main jet delivery hole.

From the fuel bowl, there is a direct path to the main jet, although in reality the drillings do go around corners. The top of the main jet should be in line with the narrowest part of the venturi where incoming air is travelling the fastest.

Fuel level in the bowl is critical and needs to be just below the level of the top of the main jet.

Too high will cause fuel leaks and a rich mixture. Too low will starve the engine of fuel at higher speeds and cause a lean mixture.




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ZENITH CARBURETTOR (CONT)

The compensating well

From the brass numbered compensating jet in the bowl, fuel passes through a drilled passage to the compensating well then another passage to the cap jet. The compensating jet allows a small amount of fuel to always be available at the cap jet and idle jet.



The mixture adjusting valve **X** is in a parallel path of drilled passages from the fuel bowl, around the compensating well to the cap jet. This allows the driver to deliver extra fuel to the engine if needed.


ZENITH CARBURETTOR (CONT)

The Fuel Flow at Idle

The idle jet sits inside a brass secondary well, which is screwed into the compensating well. Fuel reaches the secondary well through two small holes at the lower sides, then travels up through the idling jet and out a very fine hole at its tip. Air from an opening shown below mixes with the fuel at the idle air adjusting screw. The mixture is then drawn into the carburettor throat and engine, at a hole just above the throttle butterfly in the closed position.







What can go wrong?

If there are no air leaks and the float level is correct, then all that can happen is a blocked jet or things falling apart. The idle jet is very prone to blockages caused by rust or other contamination in the fuel tank. All Jets can be flow tested and soldered up then re-drilled the correct size.

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
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
