

MODEL A RESTORERS' CLUB WA Inc.Club Run, Sunday 12 July 2015.

Starting Point: Stirling Square, Guildford. Park in Stirling Street.

9.00 am for a 9.30 am departure to TOODYAY.

Morning Tea Stop – Bakers Hill. Lunch Stop – Country Women’s Association Hall, Charcoal Lane, Toodyay – 12.30 pm to 2.30 pm.

KEY: SS - Stop Sign. GW - Give Way Sign. TLts - Traffic Lights.

TJ - T Junction. TR - Turn Right. TL - Turn Left.

KSO - Keep Straight On. RAbt - Roundabout.

Proceed around Stirling Square into Johnson St then Swan Street. RAbt (Meadow St), take 2nd exit (Swan Street). OR Proceed east and TL into Meadow Street, at the RAbt take the 3rd exit into Swan Street. Pass Rose and Crown Hotel on right – Y Junction – bear left into Terrace Road. Pass Guildford Grammar School. TLts (East St) KSO. Observe speed limit signs. TLts (Morrison Rd) KSO. Proceed through Midland. Pass under Roe Highway – Gt Eastern Highway. Proceed up Greenmount. Pass John Forrest National Park. Pass through Mundaring – observe 50 kph speed limit in town. Pass through Sawyers Valley – observe the speed limit signs. Proceed on Great Eastern Highway. Slow down when you pass the BAKERS HILL 2 km Sign. Morning Tea Stop at the Information Bay on the left just before Bakers Hill townsite. Turn left into the picnic area – toilets and several picnic tables. Distance from Guildford about 58 km (36 miles). Time: 1 hour 20 minutes approximately. Enjoy morning tea.

Depart Bakers Hill 11.45 am at the latest.

TL out of the Information Bay, pass through Bakers Hill. At CLACKLINE, move into the Turn Right Lane. TR into Spencers Brook Road (to Toodyay). Almost immediately TL into Eadine Road (19 km to Toodyay). Narrow, winding road. Cross bridge and TL into Clackline-Toodyay Road to Toodyay. Admire the scenery.

TJ, TR onto Toodyay Road. Toodyay Townsite – slow down – 50 kph then 40 kph.

Proceed slowly through the main street – usually very busy on the weekend.

TL after the Freemasons Hotel into Piesse Street. TL at the IGA Store into Charcoal Lane. The Country Women’s Association Centre is on the left opposite a large parking area and toilet block. U Turn right and angle park opposite the CWA Centre just after the old building with the “Bushells” and “Signal Soap” signs. The Club has hired the CWA Hall for two hours, 12.30 to 2.30 pm, for lunch and Club Meeting. The Meeting will be followed by a short talk on Toodyay by local historian, Beth Frayne.

Members can then visit the many interesting shops and old buildings in Toodyay. Toodyay has a very good Bakery (in the main street) and several cafes and hotels.

Bakers Hill to Toodyay – about 28 km (18 miles). Total distance about 87 km (55 miles). Safe travelling. Ian and Dianne Paisley – 0427 080243.
